PacifiCorp's California Rule 26 Mobile Home Park Conversion Program

1. Introduction

In D. 14-03-021, the Commission approved a three-year pilot program to incentivize voluntary conversion of master-metered/submetered Mobilehome Parks and Manufactured Housing Communities (MHP) from a private distribution and service system to direct utility distribution and service system (MHP Program). Under the MHP Program, PacifiCorp is authorized to convert approximately 10 percent of the master-metered/submetered MHP spaces within its service territory over a three-year period.

Pursuant to D.14-03-021, Ordering Paragraph 10, requires annual reports be prepared to confirm the utilities progress in implementing the pilot program. For the second required report, each utility is required to submit a status report due on or before February 1, 2017, that includes the following items:

- Pilot timeline and where the utility is at one that timeline
- Preliminary assessment of the costs incurred per space broken out by to the meter and beyond the meter, and any other costs
- Problems experienced with the process and solutions

2. Updated MHP Program Timeline

PacifiCorp has broken the implementation of the MHP Program into six periods:

Included in the 2016 Report

- Form of Intent (FOI) Submission Period (Completed)
- Park Prioritization Period (Completed)
- Application Period (Completed)

Updates on open activities on 2016 Report

- Agreement Period
- Construction Period
- Project Closure

<u> Agreement Period – Completed</u>

The two selected MHPs completed the MHP agreements and selected electrical contractors to perform the beyond-the-meter work. Meetings with the residents will be completed by the end of March.

Construction Period – Not Started

Construction is anticipated to start the spring of 2017 and be completed by the fall of 2017.

<u>Project Closure – Not Started</u>

PacifiCorp anticipates being able to complete the conversion for both parks by the end of 2017.

3. Preliminary Cost Assessment

PacifiCorp's preliminary cost assessment is included in Attachment A. Due to the delays outlined in the next section, the Company will provide an update after the projects' closure dates.

4. Challenges and Obstacles

Several significant issues have delayed the construction of the MHP conversion project. Few qualified electricians in the area were available to work on the project, and it was further delayed after one electrician dropped out. The company has met multiple times with the park owners and the electricians to clarify the division of the work between to the meter and beyond the meter. After working through these delays, the construction season was rapidly closing and this winter's weather prohibited breaking ground on the construction.
