– CPUC Administrative Law Judge Karl Bemesderfer Receiving comments and information from members of the public is critical to the California Public Utilities Commission's (CPUC) decision-making process. Below is information on how to comment on the CPUC proceedings.

How Do Public Comments Inform Decision-Making?

CPUC Commissioners and Administrative Law Judges read public comments to gain information about the public's concerns and needs, such as the impact a rate increase will have on consumers. Public comments have had a clear impact. Commissioners and Administrative Law Judges have used public comments to change the scope of proceedings, open new investigations, and make decisions in proceedings.

How Do I Submit Comments?

You can submit comments in several ways.



- 1. **SUBMIT A COMMENT ONLINE:** You can search and find specific proceedings to comment on at www.cpuc.ca.gov/docket.
- 2. **MAIL YOUR COMMENT TO:** CPUC Public Advisor, 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, CA 94102.
 - 3. **SPEAK AT A CPUC EVENT** that has an impact on consumers, such as a public forum, hearing, or workshop.
